## General Information

As we all become more settled and familiar with the new routines, it is important that we continue to be vigilant to ensure the safety of all pupils, staff, families and the wider community. We continue to reinforce good hand hygiene with the children as well as reminding them of the need to distance from adults where possible. We appreciate your support in reinforcing these messages at home.

For younger children who are bringing a packed lunch to school, we would again ask that packaging is partially opened to minimise the need for adults to open packaging for them. Crisp packets and biscuit wrappers can be tricky for little fingers!

A reminder that all communication with school staff should be via telephone or email. We are unable to hold face to face discussions at present, particularly at the school gate where 2-meter distancing must be observed.

Should the injury be more serious, or your child has a head bump, we will of course inform you by telephone as well as sending an email.

Due to current guidance around Covid, we are unable to use reading books as normal at the moment. We are continuing to use Giglets to support reading which the children will be familiar with from home learning. We would encourage you to support your child's reading at home. Younger children will benefit from regular stories and older children should be encouraged to read texts regularly throughout the week.

## Government Guidance Covid 19

Updated Government Covid 19 Guidance around the numbers of people and number of households who can meet up came into effect this week. With this in mind, it is vital that we all play our part in adhering to the rules to ensure the safety of pupils, staff, families and our wider community. This message has been reiterated by NHS Grampian Health Protection Team who have asked that we communicate the importance of sticking to the rules across our school communities.

## Social Media

We know that many of our older pupils are likely to have a level of access to social media platforms. As a school, we continue to discuss the risks, benefits and responsible use of social media as part of the Health and Wellbeing curriculum and encourage you to reinforce this at home alongside supervising your child's usage. It is worth noting that all social media platforms have age ratings for use and most of them require children to be 13 or older to hold an account. Occasionally, situations arising from use of social media do spill over into school. There are many organisations who provide practical ideas and information to support families with various social media platforms. The website [www.internetmatters.org](http://www.internetmatters.org) has excellent information and tips, including the following around age ratings:

*Most social media apps have a minimum age rating of 13.*

*If a social network has set an age limit it means that some of the content may not be suitable for a younger child.*

*Recommendations if your child is under the minimum age for a social network and they want to join:*

- Research the social network, find out what type of content your child may be exposed to. Decide whether they're ready for it. Encourage them to join age-appropriate social networks like Kuddle.*
- Discuss if they're mature enough to handle the type of content they may see on social platforms and if you feel comfortable with them possibly being in contact with adults and strangers.*
- We'd strongly advise you to follow the minimum age rating. If you do say yes, use strict privacy settings and either 'friend' your child or ask a family member to.*

Please take time to look at the website for further information and support as well as monitoring and discussing responsible and safe use of social media with your children.

## Annual Updates and Reminders:



### **Child Protection**

All schools are required to carry out annual training and report any situation where we think a child could be at harm as a consequence of possible abuse. Where there is the possibility that a child is at risk of abuse or neglect, the school is required to refer the child to Social Work, the Police or the Reporter. Under these circumstances, the parent would **not** normally be consulted first. Bervie School has its own Child Protection Procedures in compliance with Aberdeenshire policy, which must be followed. Copies of the procedures are available should you wish to see them.

### **Medication**

Please note that no medication can be administered by the school to a pupil without parents' written consent. If your child requires to be given medication during the school day please contact the School Office to request the appropriate consent form. Due to staffing pressures, only essential medication will be administered by the school staff e.g. inhalers, long term medication. Should your child require a short course of medication please consult your Doctor as most GPs are happy for this to be administered before/after the school day. Please advise us of any changes to your child's medical information so we can ensure we hold the most relevant details for him/her.



### **Use of the School Car Park**

This is a gentle reminder that the school car park is for school staff only and should not be used for school or BOOST drop off or collection. To ensure the safety of all our children and visitors, please refrain from crossing through the car park to leave or enter the school building. Primary 1 and 1/2 children should not use the car park as a thoroughfare to their entrance and should enter via the main gate, following the path around to the sensory garden area. This path should also be followed on exit. We would also ask that parents and carers respect road markings and refrain from stopping or parking on double yellow lines around the school as this does create risks for our pupils as they try to cross the road safely.
